Terrence Hickey, Director of Finance and Personnel

- A summary of the Mayor's Court activity was reported. The total amount transferred into the City's general checking account from Court activity was \$30,035.57. (report attached)

Councilman Stavole asked how much would the bond that was discussed in the Mayor's Caucus change if we added a hotbox for the Service Department, which would cost approximately \$45,000. Councilman Stavole stated that would save a number of man-hours that are being used for asphaltting now. Director Hickey replied that it would increase the total amount and the amount that we are rolling over a year from now. He said he would present it to the Bond Council; they have to approve all of the projects and/or equipment because they have to sign a Useful Life form based on ORC and that plays into how the note is structured.

Kathy Walsh, 11362 Blossom, asked if you are maxed out of your sick bank, are you taking the donation out of your sick bank because every year you get sick incentive if you don't use your sick time. She stated she foresees many issues with this program. Council President Gallo asked to clarify her question, "are you asking if you donate time, does it affect your sick incentive?" Director Hickey replied that it is in the ordinance and it does not impact the donor's sick incentive. Ms. Walsh asked if the sick time cap been raised, Director Pokorny replied it had not been raised. Ms. Walsh stated she feels like this program would be promoting sick abuse.

Ms. Walsh asked if the City got a generator at the cell tower by a carrier, Director Pokorny responded that the carrier never put a generator in.

Ms. Walsh stated that the Income Tax link on the website is very user-unfriendly. She also stated as a resident and an employee of the City she always paid her 3% and she cannot believe the amount that has to be paid by the average person in income tax. Because of the amount paid currently, she feels it is wrong to ask residents to pay more for rubbish or raise income tax.

Ms. Walsh stated she is surprised at the fact that we are not using Squires as the Bond Council for the note discussed during the Mayor's Caucus. She is concerned on why the City is changing Bond Council after being with Squires for many years.
